The site of the barracks at Bangor, which was destroyed by fire on the 10th of August, 1862, is shown in the foreground of the illustration. The buildings were completely consumed, and the only remains are the foundations and a few walls. The surrounding country is a fertile plain, and the town of Bangor is visible in the distance.
