Dear Miss Mistral:

I am sending you by separate mail a little booklet which you may find of passing interest. It is the record of some meetings held during the summer vacation period in a country place about 100 miles from New York, at an estate which was planned originally by the former students of Ruskin and Morris. The artistic and literary company which grew up along "Byrdcliffe" at Woodstock, New York, in the Catskill Mountains, found a pleasant situation for their discussions.

The little booklet has been printed by the local printer and is by no means free of typographical mistakes. Nevertheless, it is hoped that some of the discourses will prove of interest.

This is in a sense a parallel to the meetings at Pontigny, and the text has been sent to a number of friends and colleagues in Europe to whom the enterprise might seem of interest. In a sense this distribution makes it something like the "Entretien" of the Committee on Intellectual Cooperation although, unfortunately in this regard, it is all by American authors.
