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My Dear Miss Mistral:

First I want to tell you how honored we all were to have you with us last Thursday, and how much pleasure your visit gave us. It was truly a memorable day in the history of our sanatorium.

May I ask your forgiveness for any misunderstanding which may have arisen regarding the pictures you so graciously permitted us to take of you. We were told by Father McClair that Mrs. Kerr was the person who made the arrangements for your various appearances, and that is why we first approached you through Mrs. Kerr. I personally told her that we should like to take pictures of you when you visited us, the pictures to be published in the press and in our patients' magazine. Mrs. Kerr said that you would have no objections. We therefore arranged to have the photographer present.

Last Friday Mrs. Kerr created considerable confusion at our sanatorium office by demanding that we turn over all pictures and negatives to her. She then phoned me at home and declared that she was speaking for you and insisted that no photographs be released to the press.

We are, of course, ready and happy to oblige you, Miss Mistral, in any way we can. If you do not wish any of the pictures released and you would like to have all the prints we shall be glad to give them to you. It would give us great pleasure, and it would aid us in our work of helping the unfortunate persons who are in our care, if we could publicize the fact that you honored us in your visit and were pleased by what you saw. I am enclosing a copy of a letter Thomas Mann gave us some time ago, which will illustrate the use to which we should like to put a statement from you.

I would be deeply grateful if you would grant me the privilege of an interview with you any time at your convenience in order to discuss this matter further and to conclude it to your satisfaction.
