Dear Señorita Mistral:

I have gone into the matter concerning which you wrote me and find that there seems to be no difficulty about it, except that Mr. Langlois has not yet made the declaration to the effect that he will be responsible for his sister and niece and see that they do not become a public charge. He should make this declaration at once, and I am sure it will all work out satisfactorily.

As a semi-Chilean, permit me to tell you how proud of you I am, and how proud the Chileans should be. I was fond of Aguirre Cerda, who was a real democrat, a great humanitarian, a champion of education of the masses, and I know the part he played in recommending you for the Nobel Prize. I hope you are happy in my country, where you are appreciated.

It was a pleasure, of course, to send the flag to your home town. I suppose you have seen Mrs. Ferguson's book "Chile". The best part of it is the first chapter on you, your outlook and your rare work.

I shall keep in touch with the Consulate here about the matter of the visas. There is no possible reason why the sister and niece should have the least difficulty. If there is any red-tape to be cut, I shall take it up if necessary with the highest authorities in the United States.
