Dear Friend:

Rosika Schwimmer, world patriot, has been nominated as a candidate for the 1948 Nobel Peace Prize by Members of Parliament, University Presidents and Professors of many countries.

She has been the effective champion of so many progressive causes that her achievements would have sufficed to distinguish at least a dozen people. She has been an outstanding pioneer of the woman suffrage cause, in organizing women workers in Hungary and in the State's care of underprivileged children. She has been history's first woman ambassador (Hungary to Switzerland, 1918/19).

Of chief interest to us, however, are her pioneer efforts for peace. Outstanding is her heroic work in 1915 for the organization of a Neutral Conference for Continuous Mediation which resulted in one of the great popular initiatives for peace. The organization of a World Federation of Nations as a basic part of the peace negotiations and her pioneer work for world government since 1914 are of inestimable value. Not only has she developed the philosophy of the movement, now accepted internationally, but also new approaches to its realization such as the newly launched efforts to organize a People's World Constituent Assembly which Rosika Schwimmer has advocated since 1937.

In many countries, younger leaders, inspired and trained by Rosika Schwimmer, are making outstanding contributions in the various branches of the peace movement.

It would give those striving for a peaceful world great encouragement internationally if this heroic woman were to receive the Nobel Peace Prize. You can help secure this award for her by writing to the Nobel Committee (Nobel Institute, Oslo, Norway) supporting her candidacy and also securing resolutions of support from organizations of which you are a member.

I would appreciate a copy of your supporting letter and of resolutions for the files of the Committee.
