(1) The primacy of morality in political life and in economic and social relations.  
(2) The morality to be based on the Christian tradition and on respect

for human personality and its rights.  
(3) The necessity for civil and political liberty, with a just balance between liberty and authority as well as between the in-

dividual and society, in every type of modern State.  
(4) Permanent union and cooperation between States on a basis of equality, with the progressive for-

mation of international law.  
(5) The conviction that war should no longer be recognized as a legitimate means of settling international disputes, and

must be replaced by a system of obligatory or compulsory arbitration or by the decisions of an international court of justice, at the cost that may be.
