Dear Colleague:

Thank you kindly for your letter relevant to your campaign against genocide and for the corresponding literature.

I reiterate once again my desire to cooperate with you in this - campaign.

To be prompt, I shall briefly point out some suggestions concerning the propaganda to be made in Latin America.

There are in New York a few persons who will be able to help you a great deal. If possible you could see them and talk to them jointly: a) The best contemporary novelist of our countries, Mr. Ciro Alegria, 817 Midland Ave., Yonkers, N.Y; b) The Colombian essayist and journalist Mr. German Arciniegas whose works have been translated into English and a very highly qualified person. At present he is Professor at Columbia University; c) Perhaps the Argentine writer, Victoria Ocampo, is still in New York. She is the owner and Editor of the Review "Sur" of Buenos Aires. She is not an advocate of Peron and, to my opinion, she is very much qualified to carry out a campaign of this kind. Her human courage is profound, her intellectual integrity perfect, but it takes time to win her over. I deeply wish that in this or at some other occasion you will have the opportunity of knowing her personally. She usually stays at the Waldorf-Astoria. Aldous Huxley whom I hear is now in N.Y. must be informed as to her present - address.

The Review "Nueva Democracia" is being published in N.Y. at 156 Fifth Avenue. Its editor Mr. Alberto Rembao could be of great assistance to you. Although the review is protestant, it circulates freely through South America.

In Mexico is published an important review "Cuadernos Americanos". Its editor, Daniel Cossío Villegas, perhaps could reprint some of your literature against genocide. His address is Avenida Republica de Guatemala 42, Mexico, D.F.

The Minister of Foreign Affairs in Mexico, Mr. Jaime Torres Bodet, is a writer. A brief note from colleague to colleague will please him greatly and will win his cooperation.
