

Gabriela Mistral

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She was born in 1890 in a small town in Chile. She was a poet, a teacher, and a social worker. She was the first Latin American woman to win the Nobel Prize in Literature in 1954. Her poetry is known for its simplicity and its deep emotional content. She wrote in Spanish and in her native language, Mapuche. Her most famous poem is "Un Recuerdo de mi Padre" (A Memory of My Father).

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
