

Belgium Becomes a Republic

BRUSSELS, Jan. 10.—The Belgian people have today elected a republic. The new constitution, which was adopted by the National Assembly in 1893, has been put into effect. The king, Leopold II., has abdicated in favor of his son, Albert I., who has accepted the throne. The new republic is the first of its kind in Europe.

The new constitution provides for a separation of powers between the executive, legislative and judicial branches. The executive power is vested in the king, who is elected by the National Assembly for a term of ten years.
