She is, to date, the only Nobel-Prize Winner (in literature) from Latin America. She was famous, not only throughout Latin America, but throughout Europe as a great educator and diplomat. She worked with the League of Nations, the United Nations, and was perhaps the most important world figure in the founding of UNICEF.
