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Dear Miss Dana:

This letter confirms the telephone conversation between Miss Joan Daves, your authorized agent, and Mr. Wisdon, of the Hispanic Foundation, on November 2, 1970 concerning permission for the Library of Congress to issue a long playing record of Gabriela Mistral reading her own poetry, with an accompanying booklet containing the Spanish text of the poems. Let me briefly describe below the contents of the record of Gabriela Mistral poetry to be issued by the Library of Congress, the accompanying booklet to be published with the record, and the size of the edition of each.

On December 12, 1950 Gabriela Mistral recorded for the Library of Congress, Archive of Hispanic Literature on Tape, 18 of her poems. The record will contain all 18 of these poems.

To accompany the record the Library proposes to publish a booklet, not to exceed 32 pages, containing a brief introduction and the text of the 18 poems in the Spanish language for non-exclusive distribution throughout the world.

The Library proposes to publish limited editions of both the record and the booklet in an amount set to exceed 2,000 copies for sale. (Approximately 100 additional copies may be produced for review and other promotional purposes.) Initially the record will be issued in an edition of 500 copies, and reissued if public demand warrants.

The record, with the booklet, will sell for approximately \$4.50 a copy and will be for sale by the Music Division of the Library of Congress.

It is my understanding that you will provide the Library of Congress with a statement identifying your copyright for inclusion in the booklet and the jacket of the record. In consideration for the rights to publish the Gabriela Mistral record and accompanying booklet, as described above, I can offer you a fee in the amount of \$500.00, payable on your signing this agreement.
