How are all the many members of your lovely family, Olaya and Dona Carmela, and the seven little ones who imagine are quite big by now? How far away you all seem. I hope it is space that causes that, and not the affections of the heart, or that you have forgotten me.

I am glad to see that while has a person like you so think of its future with courage and an optimistic heart. Perhaps destiny will not work out things always as we would like then and in that sense optimism may be futibe, but I think it is very important to be optimistic in the sense of believing that such-and such is possible, or could be
