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College Linguist To Research In Spain

Dr. Magda Arce, assistant professor of European languages at Hilo College, has finalized plans for her trip to Madrid, where she will spend the summer doing research on a grant from the Instituto de

Cultura Hispanica.

She will leave June 3 for New York, where she will board a flight to Madrid that is being chartered by the American Association of Spanish Teachers.

Accompanying Dr. Arce will be her daughter, Diana Lopez-Ray Arce, who is graduating this month at Manoa campus of the University of Hawaii.

The grant awarded to Dr. Arce will enable her to do

research at the University of Madrid on "The Generation of Contemporary Spanish Literature, after the Spanish Civil War."

Dr. Arce joined the faculty of Hilo College in April of 1970, and is in charge of the Spanish and Portuguese courses. A native of Chile, she has had 21 years of university teaching experience. She received her master's degree from Columbia University in New York, and her doctorate from the University of Chile.

For three years she was personal interpreter of Romulo Betancourt, former president of Venezuela.

Dr. Arce is due back in Hilo Aug. 28.
