

Parental Effects: Social Structures and Change

It is a truism that the cultural context shapes child development. This paper reviews the evidence for this claim, with particular emphasis on the role of the family. The review is organized around three main themes: (1) the role of the family in the development of the child's social and cognitive skills; (2) the role of the family in the development of the child's emotional and psychological well-being; and (3) the role of the family in the development of the child's physical health and development. The review concludes that the family is a central and powerful influence on child development, and that understanding the family is essential for understanding the child.
