My dear Sir,

Having had the pleasure of your acquaintance, during the troublous times of the late Revolution in Chili, while I was attached to the Corbeta Santa Maria; which vessel was part of the American Squadron deployed for duty on that Coast, and participating alike, in the feeling, with the rest of the American Officers of the Squadron, for the success of the liberal party, whose enlightened opinions throughout the civilized world, are the only safeguards to Republican Institutions. I take the liberty of writing you, knowing full well you are always ready to advance the interests of your Country. It was with many regrets that I sailed from Valparaiso without meeting you in person, after the many vicissitudes you had passed through, in so noble a cause; but duty and the exigencies of the Service, required that we should proceed on the Cruise, which the Government of the United States had destined for us. Sailing from Valparaiso on the latter part of December last, we arrived via Callao, on the 18th February at San Francisco, from which place the St. Marys sailed.
