my dear

Pedro

I arrived here last evening after
a ride during the day of twenty leagues over
the most impossible roads in Chile. I remain
eighteen days under the Camba had died
at times with Fuma & the thermometer
from midday until eight o'clock at night
thirty five degrees - but all my trials
& tribulations I look upon as nothing find-
ing that I have by these sufferings achieved
agitation & victory. Now I did when in
the campaign of 1818 I gave to Chile the
command of the Pacific ocean to moment
I shall take out specimens of the
mine discovered by Com. & J. F. de Rosania
& if it does not as you miners say Rosas-
ian I think that before the owner is out
that I shall find my self well made a
Independent man - the mine of Pedro Caspa
& Camp is at present - and already been
some time. Remembering your success in
the metals are half-Valley. C. Wooster
