

San Francisco 24th March 1846

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My dear Felix -

I have returned from the Rio
Serrano mine of the Chilean province of Valparaiso
& I am anxious to tell you of my return from said mine
I have been to visit that the Chilean has been
cutting these roads in the rich lands of
Valparaiso, rather than I should have been
in the desert place for the last two months.
He has been leading me in with dogs foraging
me with metals which he said that he had
extracted from two new mines that he had
discovered in the hills with his hunters - & that
each mine was from one year to one half
in breadth - & that in subsequent time he would
produce rich metals brought to lower the
expense he has been - but about fifteen days
I have not heard from him since I returned
to Valparaiso from Chile - I have not yet
in it & will have mine from Chile
to see if any of the said new discovered
mines which are said after a day & a half
I have over the worst roads that ever was
traveled in Chile - and mining at said mine
a learning them with in every direction the
miners told me that they were nothing
