



groups of unmistakable Englishmen in various businesses, and the equally if not more numerous specimens of blond, portly, and highly accomplished Germans. Wherever the Chileans are left to themselves and their own devices, there will invariably be found evidences of indolence and slovenliness, although they profess to be the Yankee of South America, and the most progressive and civilized nation between Cape Horn and the Caribbean Sea. Take the public library of the capital, for instance, now lodged in the old Congress Hall. This collection comprises 70,000 volumes, in course of being catalogued; 15,000 volumes for the outdoor lending department, already catalogued; and a very large collection of colonial archives and documents, some 25,000 pieces of the greatest value for the history of New Spain. The librarian informed me that as many as a hundred readers a day made use of the large reading room, but on the day of my visit there were only nine persons there. However that may be, I could not fail to be struck by the untidy aspect of the establishment, and particularly by the fact that both readers and employees are allowed to

smoke freely cigars or cigarettes as they please, and that, too, in the very room where the archives of the nation's history are stored with inadequate care and respect. The only place where the Chileans
