Dear friend and siche,

I address you so familiarly as I read in an article — in an interview with one Chandrashekhara — that Sri Aurbindo, Sri Buddha, Christ and St. Francis have been the four rulers of your religious life. Also I read in the papers that you intended to recommend Sri Aurobindo for the Nobel Prize as my late friend Sir Francis Younghusbend too had wanted. (D enclose a copy of his letter to me written many years ago: if he had lived, our Gurudev, Sri Aurobindo would have got the Nobel Prize: not that it matters in the slightest for him, but it does matter for us, his disciples who have dedicated our lives that his gospel may bring back to our derelict planet the faith in the IMEK occult Grace leavening human conscicusness, for that alone can mingram put a term to the multiplying evils born of atheism and man the ego's rule) Also I want to read your poems as I learnt from the article referred to that you are a poet and a great poet. Unfortunately I know no spanish or Italian. I know only English, Geriman and French among the European languages. Is your "Desolacion" translated in any of these three languages? If so can you make tell me where I can get the translation, please?

I saw your photograph in the "Bibliographica Encyclopedia of the World" whence I get your address too. I hope this will reach you in about a week's time and I will expect a reply from you by, say, the 10th of next month. Our Gurudev's seventy-seventh birthday celebrations are going to whirl through the length and breadth of India, I hope, giving the lie — for the first time — to the Biblical sigh: "A prophet is not honoured in his own country." I say 'for the first time' because I agree with the sigh: otherwise India would not have taken such a long time to wake up to the presence of her Messiah of today— the only Messiah, in fact — and still look up to foreign materialistic gospels to lead her out of the wood.
