I have to keep eating now to keep my strength up—it is annoying to have to spend so much time on oneself—when I talked about the pneumonia with Nilda she pointed out how often I had been out in the rain and I'm furious right now—I thought that I had noticed having wet feet but SINCE I HAD RUBBERS ON I RULED OUT THE POSSIBILITY...PERO CARAMBA! Thursday I was out in the rain, feet soaking when I got back, I EXAMINED MY RUBBERS—they were full of little holes (and now too).

I HOPE YOURSELF, OR EVEN BETTER, OUT OF THE HORRID THIRD ACT! Nilda and I came to the conclusion that you are made of iron.
