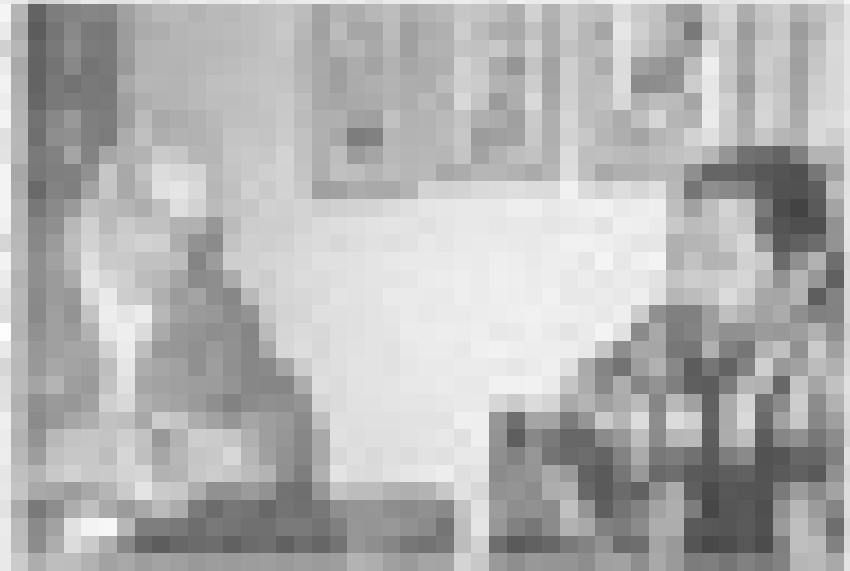




Summer hours positive return comes
