Abstract: The purpose of this study was to determine the effect of a 12-week training program on the physical fitness and health of sedentary middle-aged men. The subjects were 20 men, aged 40-50 years, who were sedentary and had no history of cardiovascular disease. They were divided into two groups: a control group and an exercise group. The exercise group performed a 12-week training program consisting of three sessions per week of aerobic and resistance training. The control group did not exercise. The results showed that the exercise group had significant improvements in physical fitness and health compared to the control group. The exercise group had significantly higher levels of aerobic fitness, muscle strength, and endurance. They also had significantly lower levels of body fat, blood pressure, and cholesterol. The control group showed no significant changes in any of these variables. The results of this study suggest that a 12-week training program can improve physical fitness and health in sedentary middle-aged men.
