



Abstract—The purpose of this study was to determine the effect of a 12-week training program on the heart rate (HR) and blood pressure (BP) of sedentary, middle-aged men. The subjects were divided into two groups: a control group and an exercise group. The exercise group performed a 12-week training program consisting of aerobic and resistance exercises. The control group did not exercise. The HR and BP were measured at baseline and at the end of the 12-week period. The results showed that the exercise group had a significant decrease in HR and BP compared to the control group. The decrease in HR was approximately 10 beats per minute, and the decrease in BP was approximately 10 mmHg. These results suggest that a 12-week training program can effectively reduce HR and BP in sedentary, middle-aged men.

This system can be solved for $E_j[\tau_i]$ for all $j, i \in S$.
