My dear Father -

I have returned from the  
discovery mine of the estate near the  
of Garrison to my father from said mine  
I have been to visit that the estate has been  
cutting these woods in the vicinity of  
Whitney, rather than I should have been  
It is in a desert place for the last two months  
He has been leading me on with days of  
me with notes which he said that he had  
extracted from two new notes that he had  
discovered in the Hill with for Hunter - & that  
each note was from one year to one dollar  
in breadth - & that in subsequent time he would  
find more rich metals throughout to lower the  
expense he has been - but about fifteen days  
I not having from him I was determined  
to Judge from my own investigation I got  
in it & will have mines from the  
to see what they are to the said new discovery  
mine which we found after a day & a half  
I passed over the wood roads that were  
I traveled in while on mining at this mine  
a few miles from me in every direction the  
mines I have told me that they were nothing
